### National Grief Awareness Week

From January 22 to 28, National Grief Awareness Week, themed 'Be Grief Aware -Show You Care,' will be observed for the fourth consecutive year under the leadership of the Irish Hospice Foundation (IHF). IHF will conduct two webinars in collaboration with the campaign: 'Bereavement Networks Lunch & Learn: Grief in the Workplace' and 'Living with Loss - Bereavement Information Evening' on Thursday, January 25. # UCC led consortium on Dementia Palliative Care Awarded EU Funding

University College Cork (UCC) researchers have secured €7.5 million in EU funding to launch the In-Touch project, addressing advanced dementia care in nursing homes. Led by Professor Nicola Cornally and Professor Suzanne Timmons, the In-Touch Consortium comprises 13 institutions across Europe, the UK, and Canada. Over the next five years, the project aims to improve palliative care for dementia patients in 56 care homes across seven countries, focusing on pain and symptom management, staff capabilities, polypharmacy, and decisionmaking. The intervention, emphasizing nonpharmacological approaches, strives to enhance the quality of life for individuals with advanced dementia while involving families in comfort care and future plans. The consortium's multidisciplinary team, supported by South South West Hospital Group (SSWHG)-UCC, is set to revolutionize dementia care through ethical, evidencebased, and cost-effective interventions.
